Notice of Race

Organizing Authority: Davis Island Yacht Club, Tampa, FL 33606 Endorsed by International Sunfish[™] Class Association (ISCA) Endorsed by US Sunfish[™] Class Association (USSCA)

1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) and the rules of the International Sunfish Class Association.
- 1.2 The US SAILING prescriptions to RRS 60.3, 61.4, 67, 76.1, Appendix R, Appendix T (Arbitration) and Appendix V (Alternative Penalties) will apply.
- 1.3 If there is a conflict between languages, the English text will take precedence.
- 1.4 In accordance with RRS G3, a boat chartered or loaned for this regatta may carry national letters or a sail number in contravention of her class rules.
- 1.5 In any rule governing the championship the notation [DP] means that the penalty for breach of the rule may, at the discretion of the protest committee, be less than disqualification. [NP] means that an infraction to the rule will not be grounds for protest by a boat. This changes RRS 60.1(a).
- 1.6 [DP] Each competitor is required to wear a lifejacket that is 100% dependent on foam for flotation and appropriate size for the sailor. Except while actively adding or removing clothing, competitors shall wear an appropriately sized U.S. Coast Guard Approved PFD. For International competitors only, competitors shall wear an appropriately sized PFD/Buoyancy aid as approved for use in the competitor's country of origin.
 - This changes the preamble to part 4 and RRS 40.

2 ADVERTISING

The Organizing Authority may require boats to display advertising in accordance with World Sailing Regulation 20.

3 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1 Each competitor's country must be a 2024 member of the ISCA.
- 3.2 Each competitor shall be a 2024 member of his/her respective country's Sunfish™ Class Association.
- 3.3 All **Masters** participants shall be 40 years of age or older as of March 17, 2024 and must meet the same age requirement to qualify for each of the age divisions: Apprentice Master 40+, Master 50+,

- Grand Master 60+, Great Grand Master 70+, and Senior Master 80+.
- 3.4 An entry is not complete until payment and online approval of the waiver have been made, and the competitor has checked in at the registration desk.

4 FEES

- 4.1 Entry Fee for International Masters: \$100.00 plus 7.5% sales tax, total \$107.50.
- 4.2 Entry Fee for US Nationals at Midwinters: \$110.00 plus 7.5% sales tax, total \$118.25.
- 4.3 There will be a late fee of \$25.00 for each event if payment is received after March 1, 2024.
- 4.4 Registration is open on Yacht Scoring. Early registration is encouraged for planning purposes.

- 4.5 Payment for both events will open on January 1, 2024.
- 4.6 Skipper's registration fee includes: regatta favor, breakfast per schedule, snacks, dinner per schedule, beer kegs and soft drinks after racing.
- 4.7 Coaches / Guests may purchase meal plans at registration desk that will include breakfast per schedule, snacks, dinner per schedule, beer kegs and soft drinks for \$75 per regatta.
- 4.8 All fees are in US Dollars and shall be free of any transfer and/or banking costs or commissions. Any charge shall be reimbursed by competitors to complete their entries.

6 MEASUREMENT

Boats and equipment must be compliant with current International Sunfish Class Association Class Rules as approved by World Sailing. Boats may be selected for measurement at any time during the regatta by the ISCA Chief Measurer or an appointed representative.

7 NOTICE TO COMPETITORS AND SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 7.1 The official notice board for International Masters is online located at Official Notice Board.
- 7.2 The official notice board for US Nationals at MidWinters is online located at Official Notice Board.
- 7.3 The Sailing Instructions will be available on the official notice board by March 11th.

8 VENUE

The regatta will be sailed from Davis Island Yacht Club, 1315 Severn Ave., Tampa, FL 33606. Racing will be in the Upper Hillsborough Bay south of the clubhouse.

9 THE COURSES

The courses will be windward – leeward, triangles, or combinations thereof.

10 SCORING

- 10.1 The Low Point Scoring System, RRS Appendix A, will apply as modified below.
 - 10.1.1 One (1) completed race is required to constitute a series.
 - 10.1.2 A maximum of nine (9) races are scheduled in each series.
 - 10.1.3 When fewer than six (6) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her scores.
 - 10.1.4 When six (6) to nine (9) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst race.

11 SUPPORT BOATS

- 11.1 The organizing authority will not provide support boats.
- 11.2 [DP] Support boats must register with the Organizing Authority prior to the first competitor's meeting on the first day of racing and fly a flag with a number provided by the Organizing Authority (a \$20 cash deposit will be required) at all times while on the water. Support boats shall carry a working VHF radio and monitor VHF channel 72 during the race.
- 11.3 [DP] All support vessels shall be equipped with a functioning engine safety cut-out switch (kill switch) which shall remain attached to the support person (operator) at all times while the engine is on. Support vessels shall check-in with the RC Signal vessel before the first race of each day to demonstrate compliance.
- 11.4 [DP] Support boats shall stay outside the racing area from the time of the preparatory signal until all boats have finished or retired or the race committee signals a postponement, general recall or abandonment. The racing area is defined as no less than 100 meters from any boats that are racing and outside the lay lines from the marks defining the course.
- 11.5 [DP] Support boats shall remain 50 meters below the starting line between the preparatory and starting signals. After the starting signal, they may only proceed to the windward mark up the left side of the course and must return to the leeward mark via the same side. At the finish, they must

- remain 50 meters below the finish line.
- 11.6 No communication from the support boats (including verbal and hand signals) will be permitted after the preparatory signal until after the competitor completes the race.
- 11.7 If a support boat does not comply with applicable rules, restrictions and/or instructions, a discretionary penalty may be applied to some or all associated competitors and may include restrictions on the movement of their support boat.
- 11.8 Support boats may be required to act as safety boats upon instruction from a race official.
- 11.9 [DP] Competitors and support persons shall comply with any reasonable request from an event official.

12 BERTHING

Boats will be kept at the Davis Island Yacht Club and in areas assigned by the organizing authority.

13 PRIZES

- 13.1 Prizes for the International Masters Championship will be given as follows:
 - 13.1.1 Top three finishers in each age division.
 - 13.1.2 Top five overall finishers.
 - 13.1.3 One berth for the 2025 Sunfish World Championships will be awarded as per the International Sunfish Class Association Class Notice.
- 13.2 Prizes for the **US Nationals at Midwinters** will be given as follows:
 - 13.2.1 Top ten finishers.
 - 13.2.2 Four US berths for the 2025 Sunfish World Championships will be awarded as per the USSCA Class Notice.
 - 13.2.3 Highest placed Female finisher (if the top finisher is male) or the highest placed Male finisher (if the top finisher is Female).
 - 13.2.4 Highest placed Youth (less than 19 years old during the calendar year 2024).
 - 13.2.5 Highest placed Master (40+).

14 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See Rule 3, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury, illness, disease or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

15 MEDIA RIGHTS

By participating in this event, competitors automatically grant to the OA and the event sponsors the right, in perpetuity, to make, use, and show, at their discretion, any photography, audio and video recording, and other reproductions of them made at the venue or on the water from the time of their arrival at the venue, until their final departure, without compensation.

16 INSURANCE

The organizing authority requires that each competitor shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance.
